Types of Notices

Response Due Dates

Response due dates are crucial when it comes to dealing with letters. Read the notices when you receive them and note the reply date. Responding by this date will mean less interest and penalties as well as less attention afforded to you by the IRS and States.

Tax Corrections

Tax correction notices are very common. Always review these notices with the tax return you filed. If you agree with the changes- no further action is necessary, sign in agreement and pay the tax and interest due. If you do not- You will need to reply with an explanation and supporting documentation within the specified date.
